

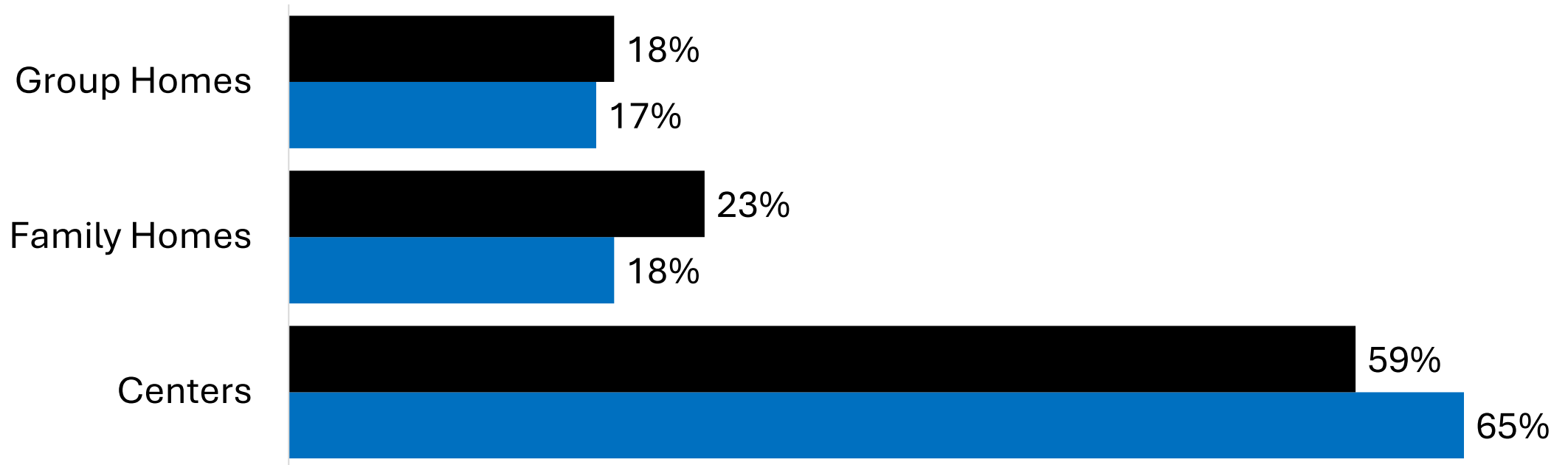

Comparison between Survey Sample and MI Providers

Provider Type

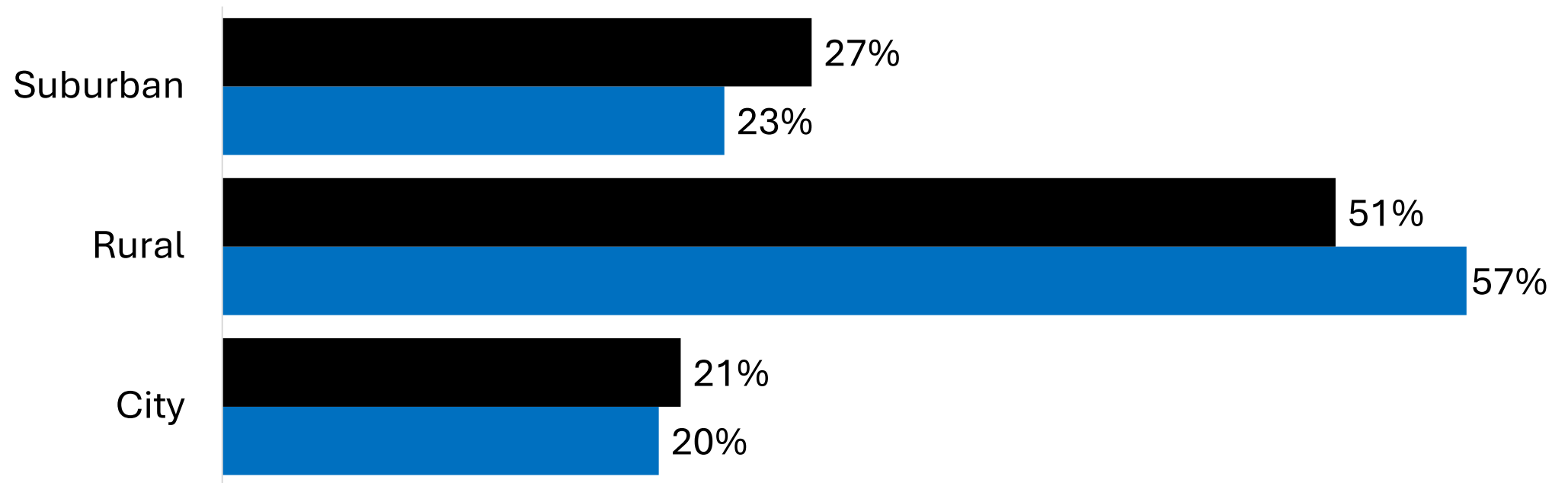
Provider types were relatively similar across the survey sample and Michigan provider population.



■ MI Licensed Provider Population (N = 7,824) ■ Survey Sample (n = 484) $X^2(2) = 3.56, p = .169$

Urbanicity

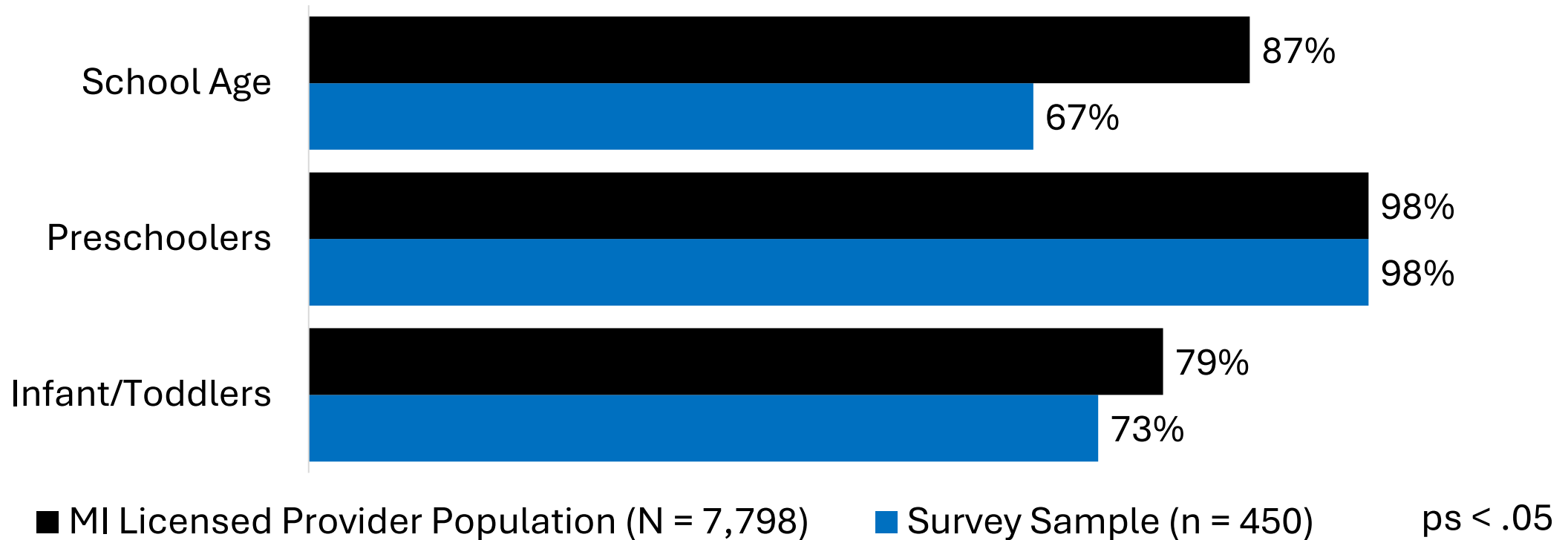
There were slightly fewer suburbs and more rural areas represented in the survey sample than MI provider population, but no significant differences.



■ MI Licensed Provider Population (N = 7,798) ■ Survey Sample (n = 450) $X^2(2) = 5.87, p = .053$

Ages Served

The sample included fewer infant/toddlers and school-aged providers than the provider population.

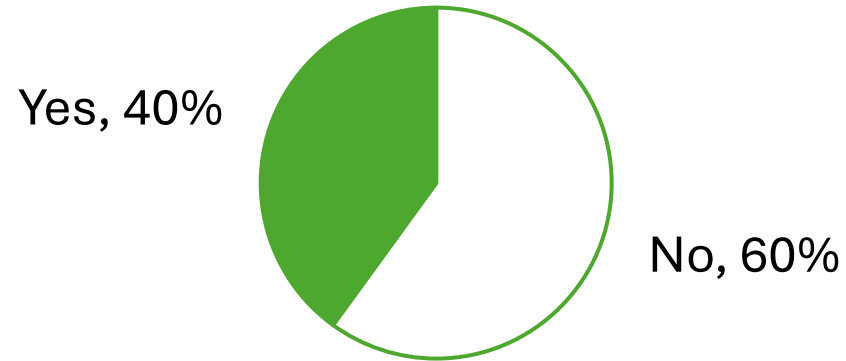
CFMF Grants Overview

From Fall 2022 to 2024, the State's Caring for MI Future project offered several grants and services to support Michigan's child care providers:

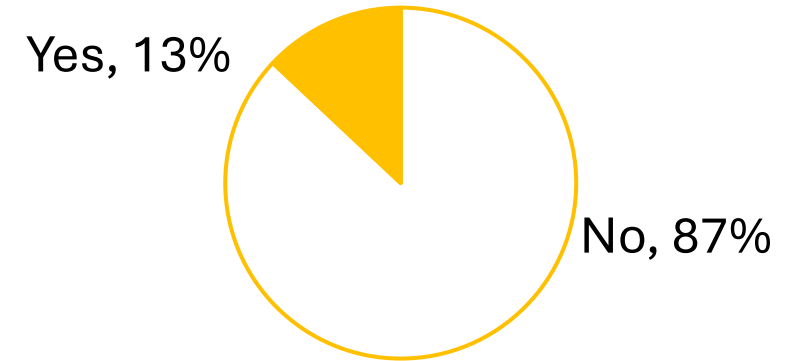
- **Facility Improvement Grants** fund facility equipment, repair, and renovations.
- **Our Strong Start** supports child care business expansion via licensing.
- **Workforce Supports** enhances staff education via the Child Development Associate (CDA) credential, apprenticeships, and Family Child Care Networks with other child care providers.
- **Business Sustainability** offers coaching, consulting, and training to maintain businesses.

Percent of Respondents Applying to Each Grant

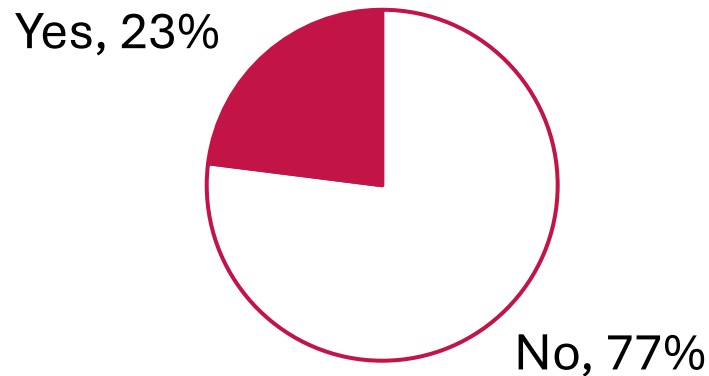

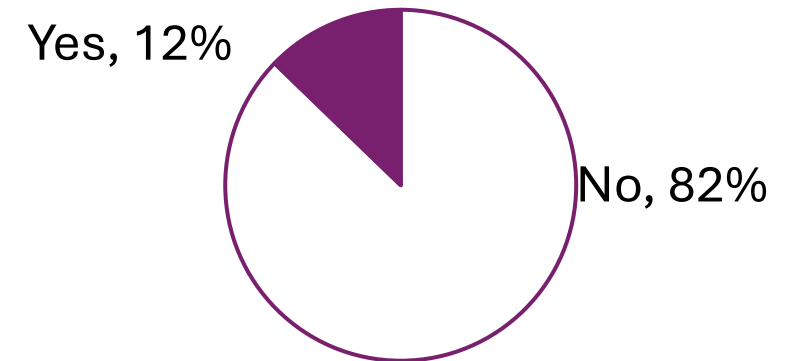

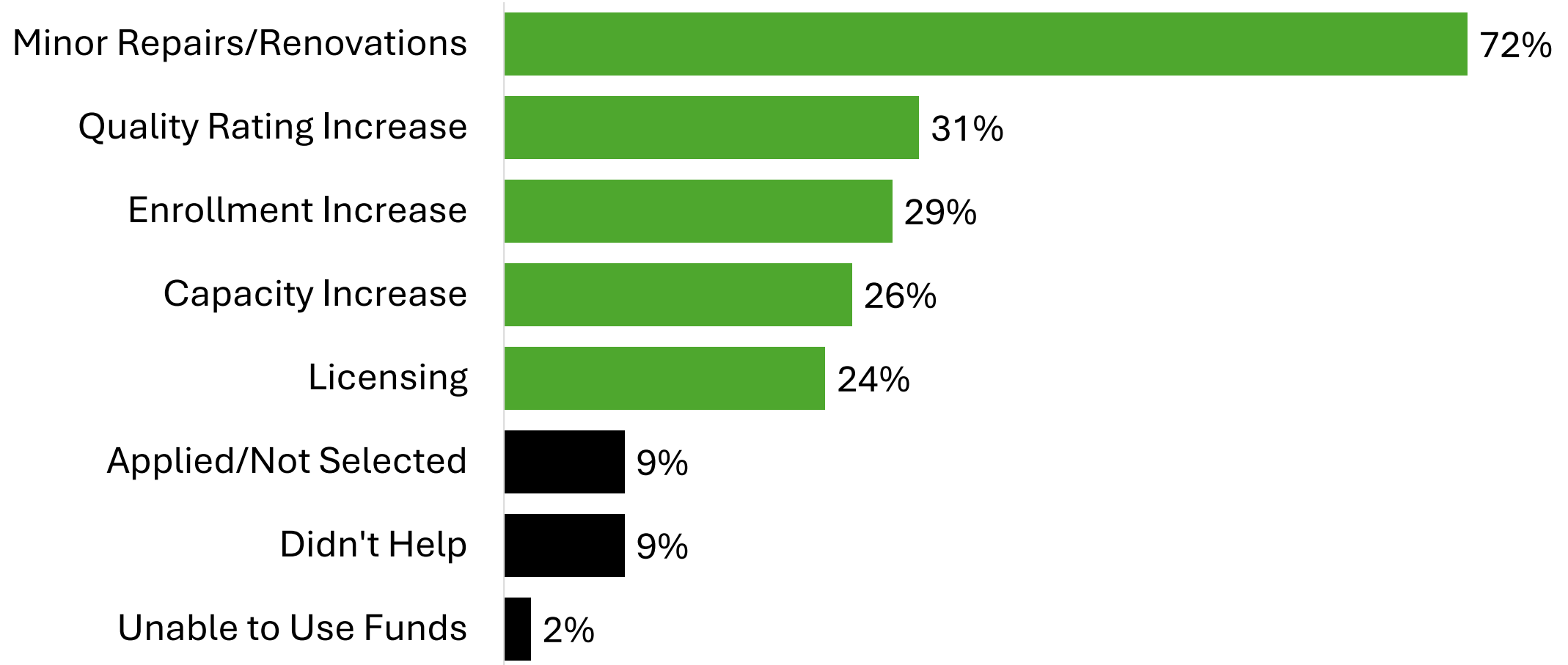

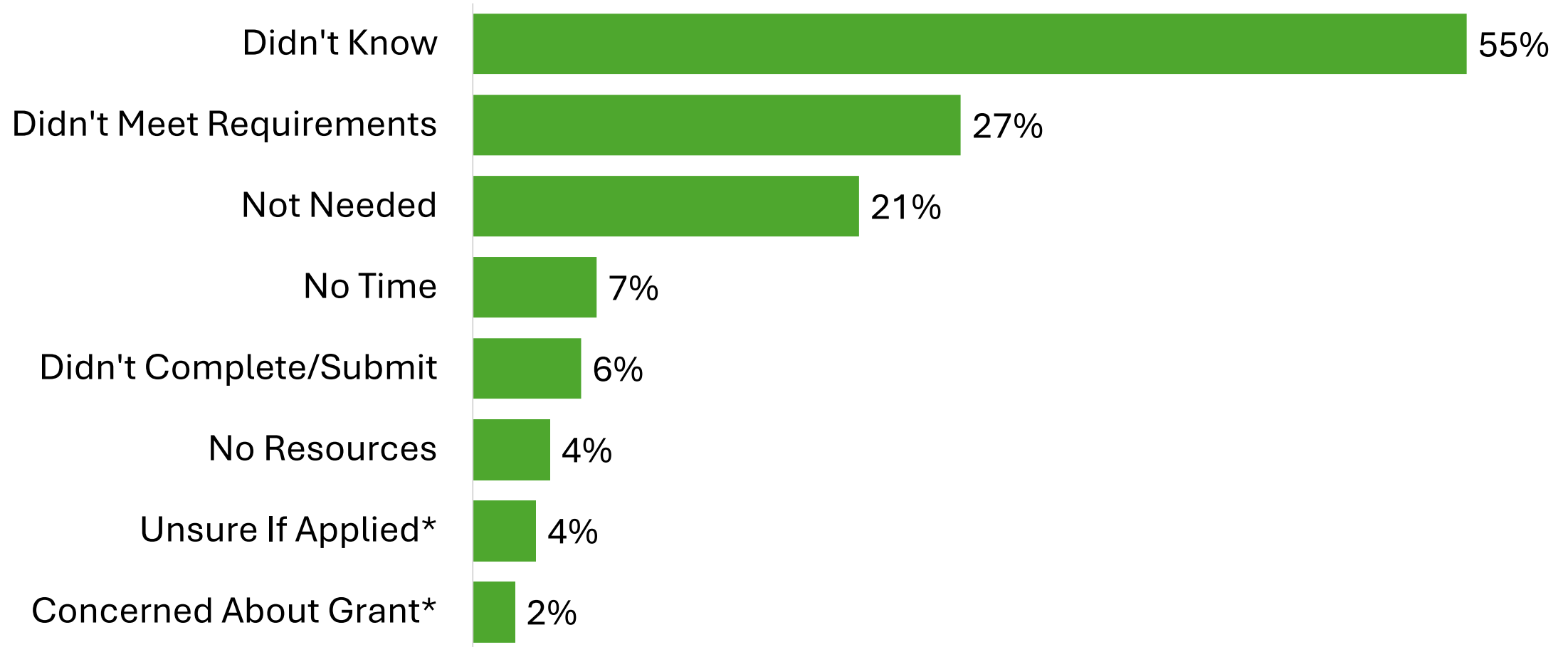

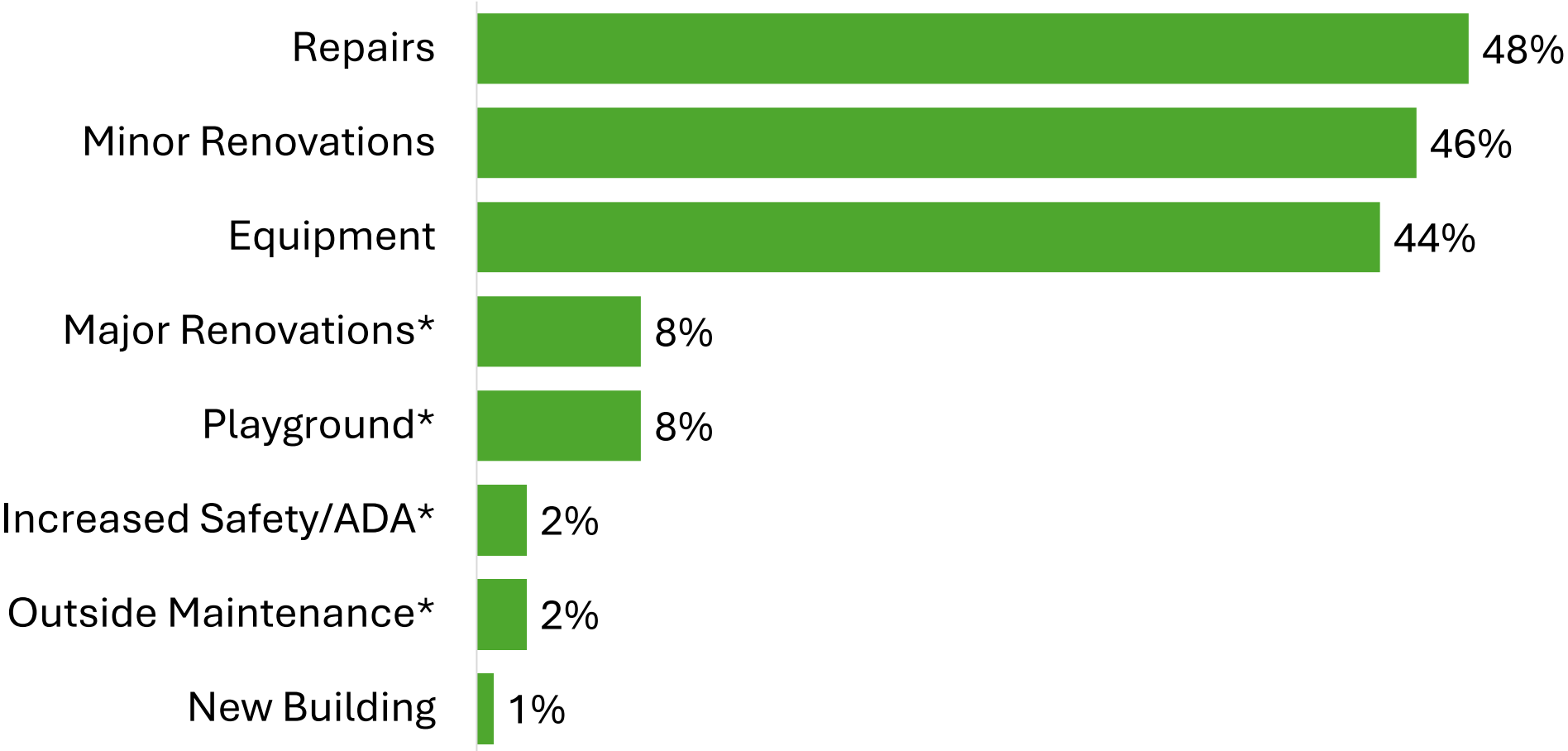

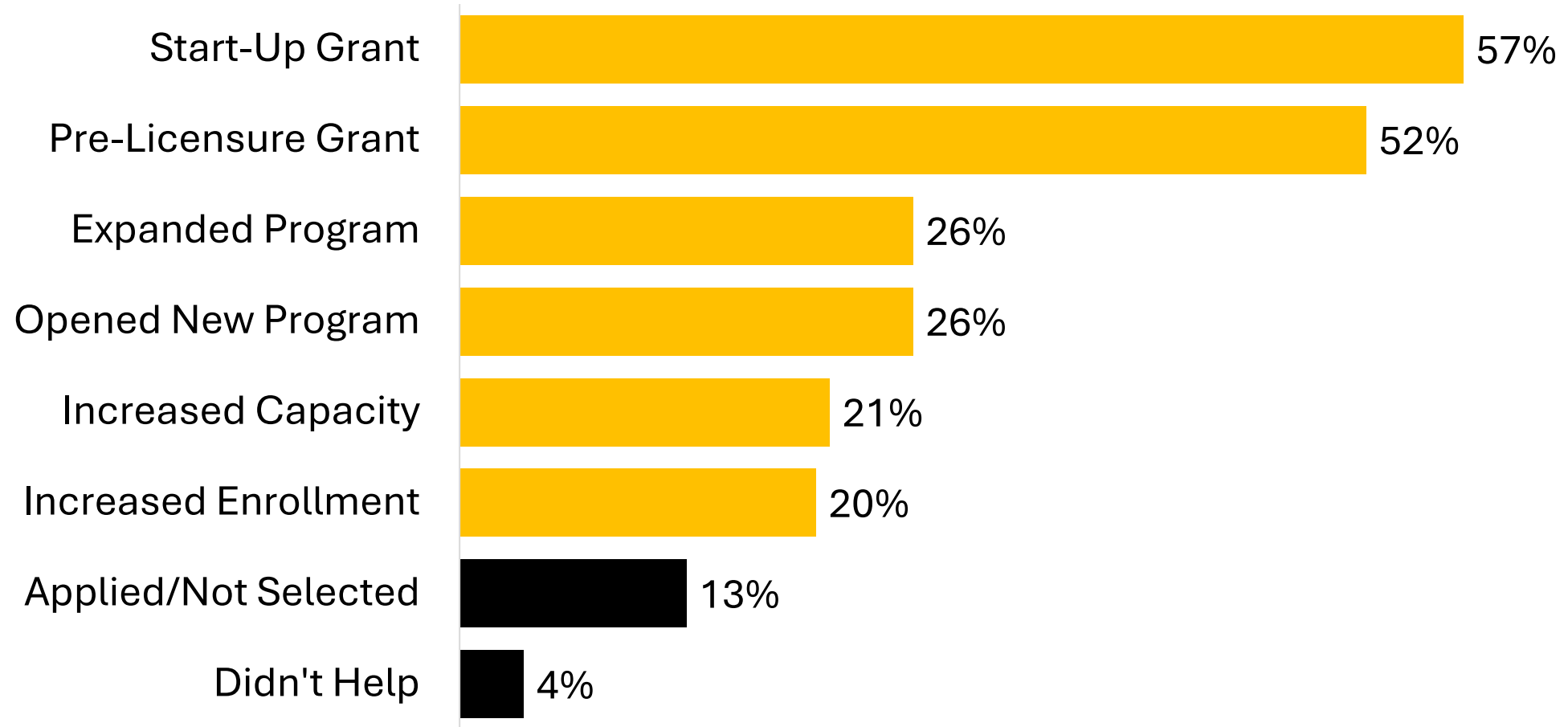
If You Didn't Apply, What Are Your Current Facility Needs?

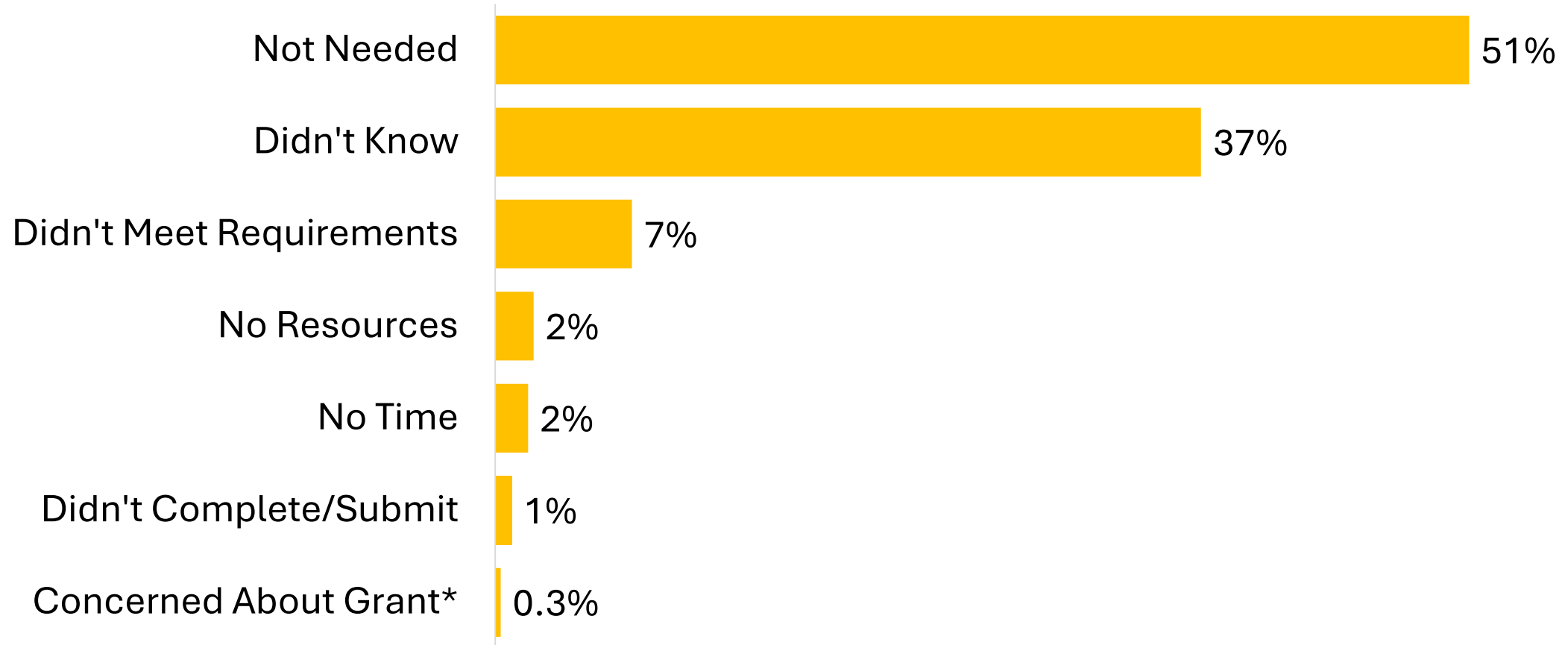

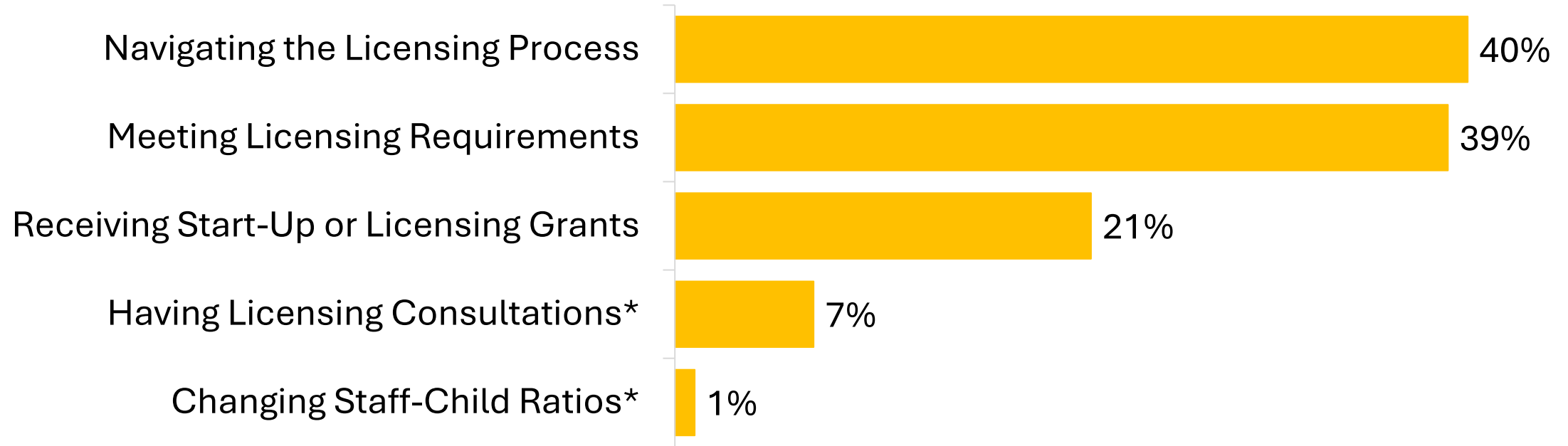

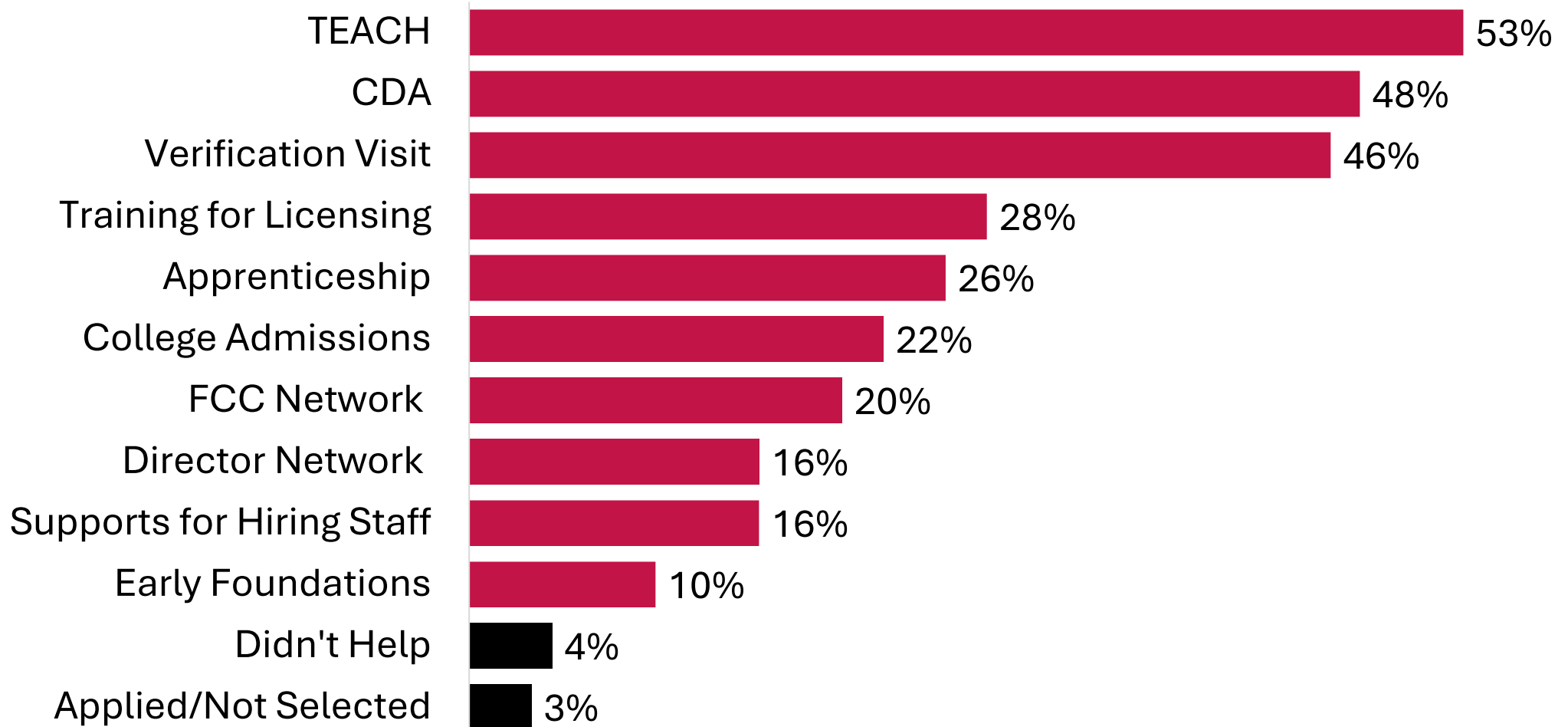
If You Didn't Apply, What Are Your Current Licensing Needs?

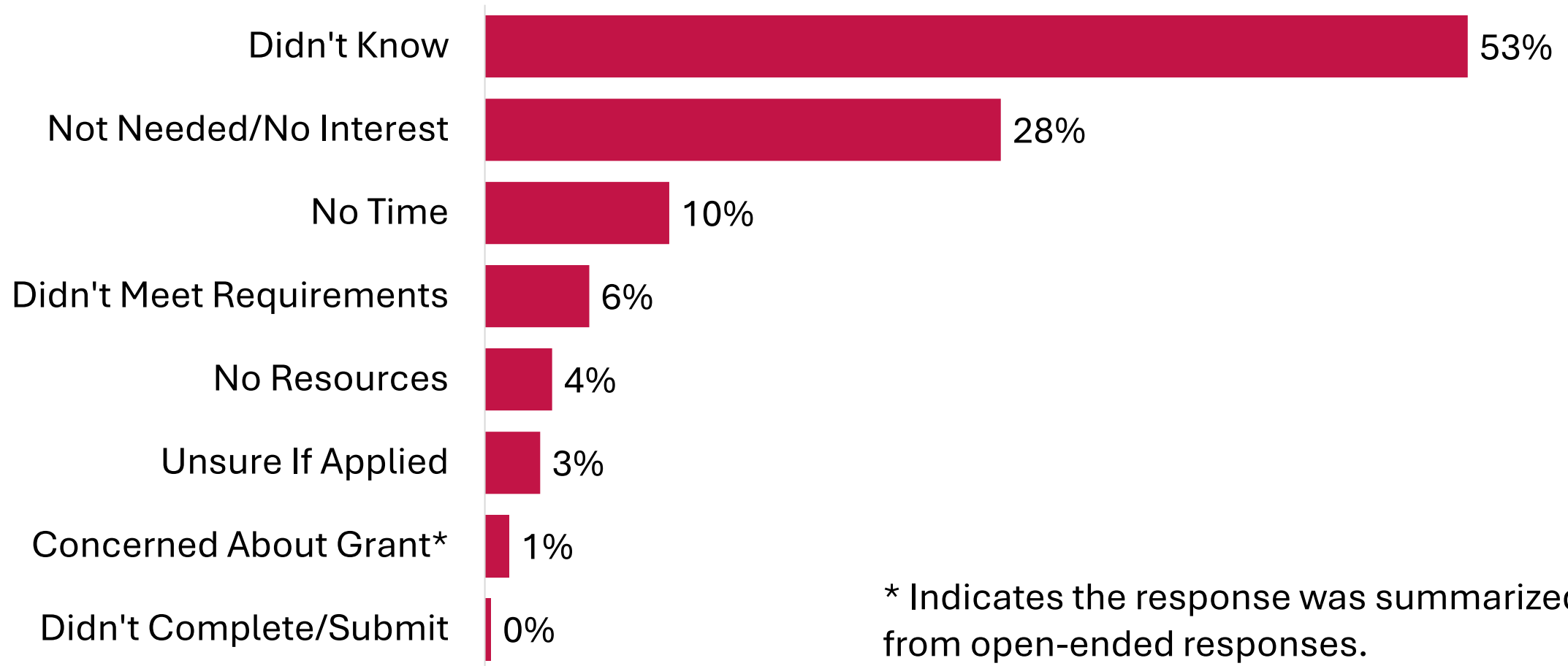

What Did You Achieve?



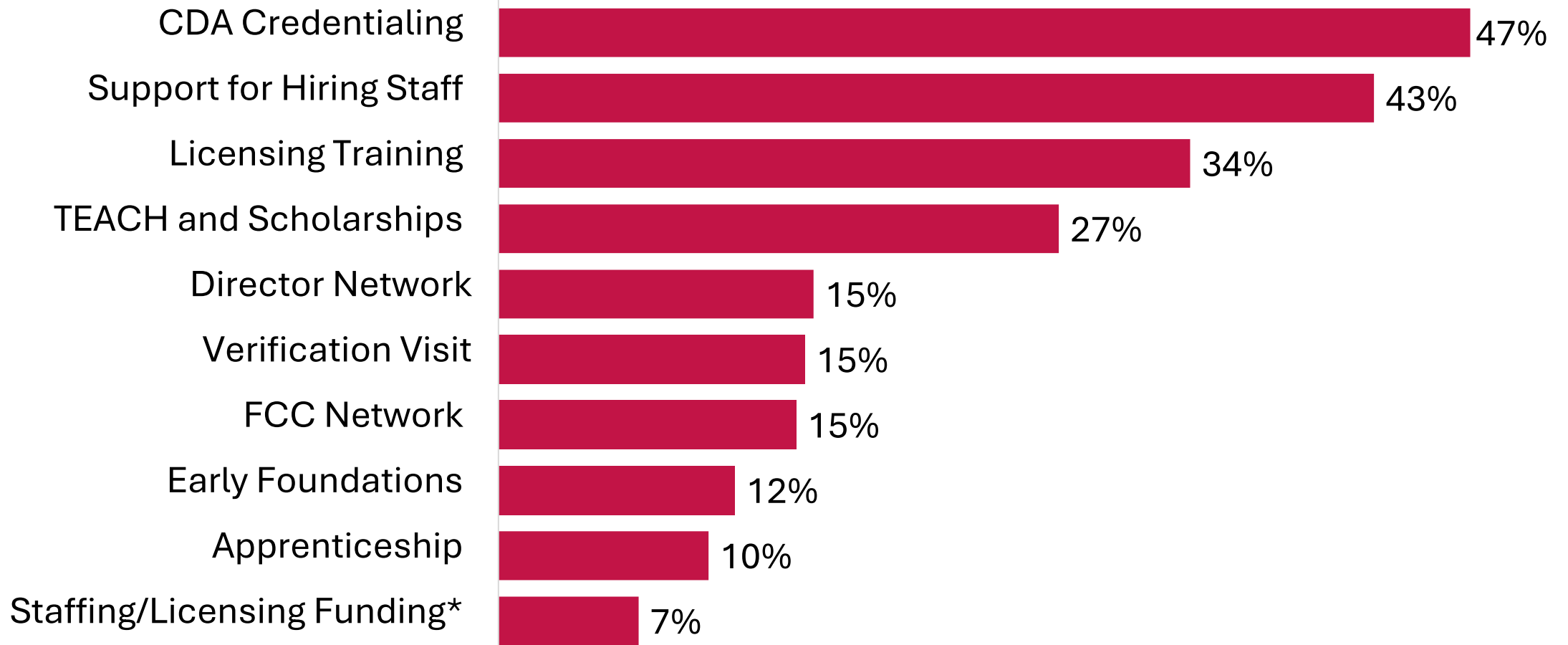

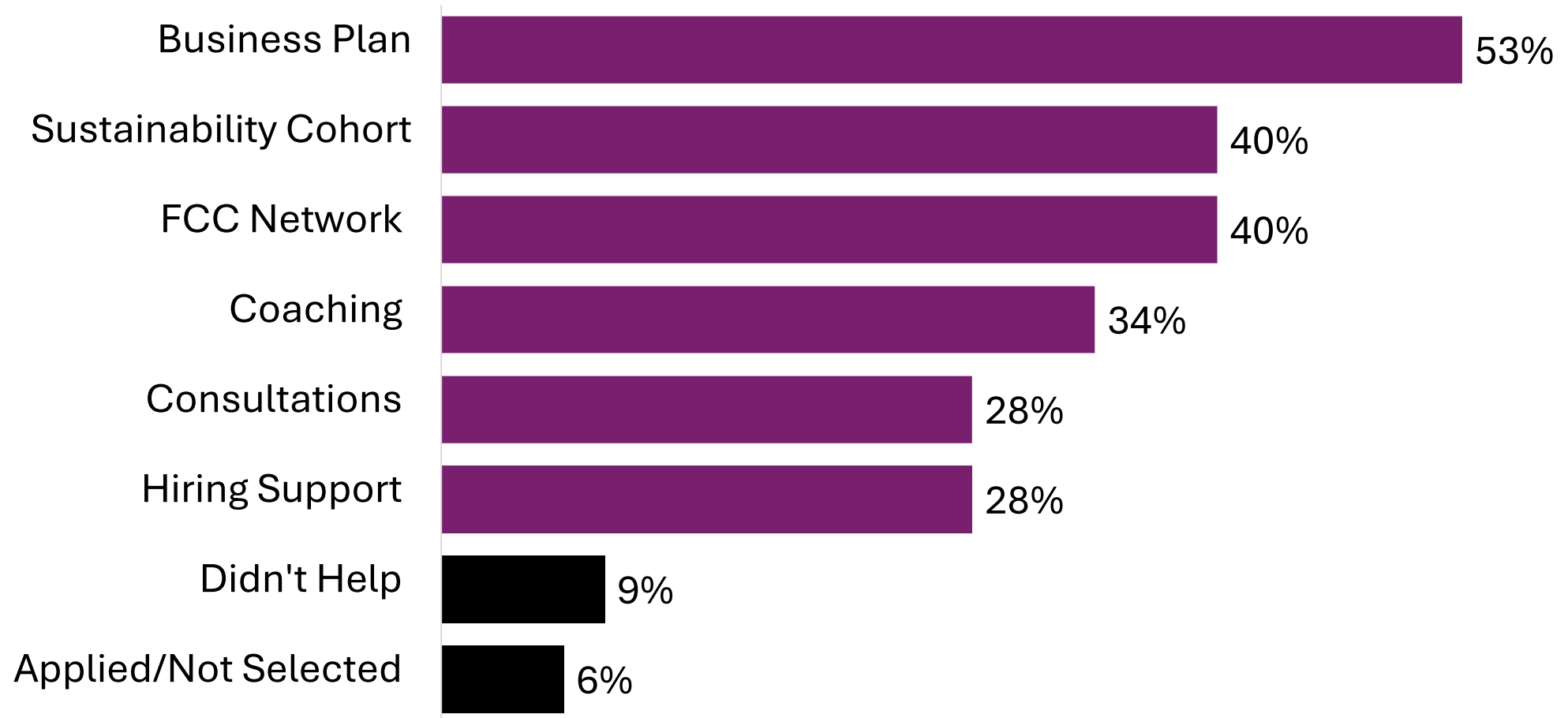
If You Didn't Apply, What Are Your Current Support Needs?

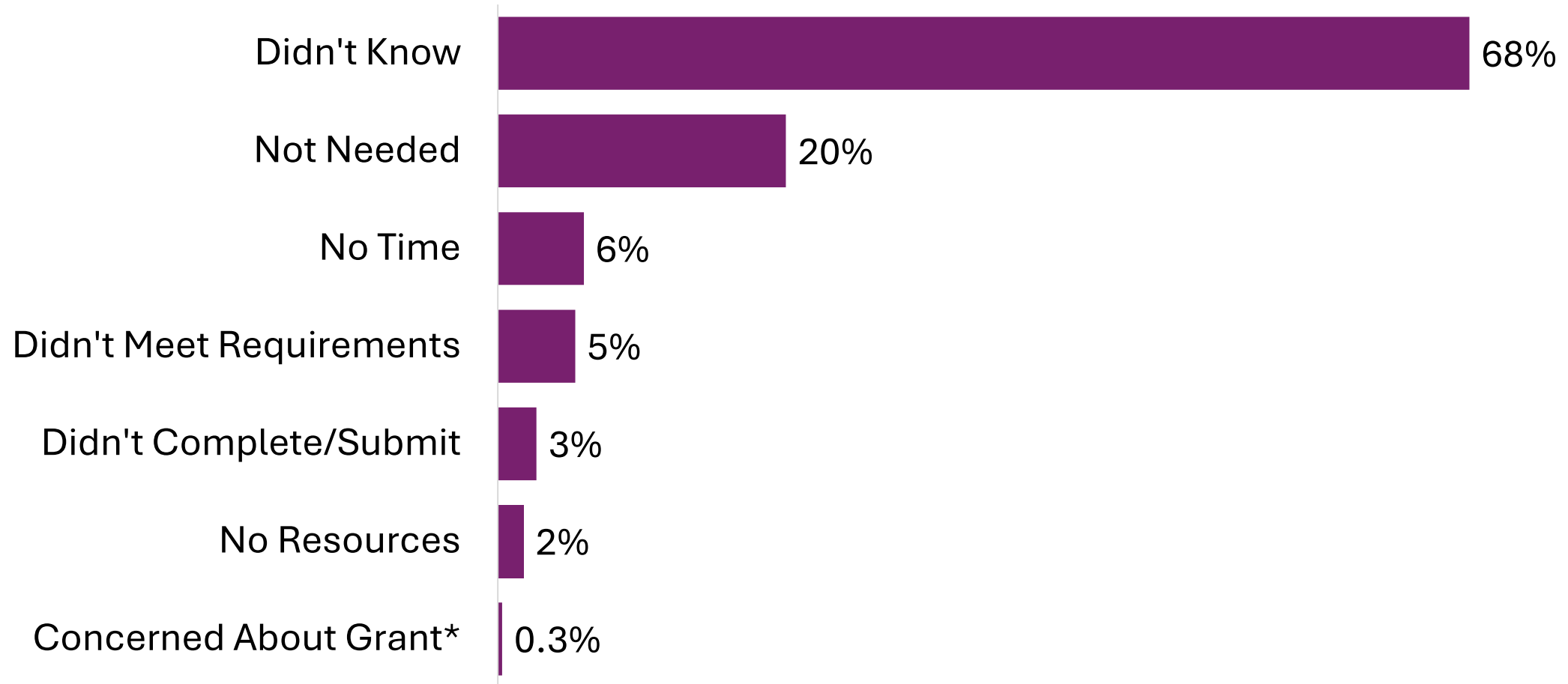
Business Sustainability (n = 47)

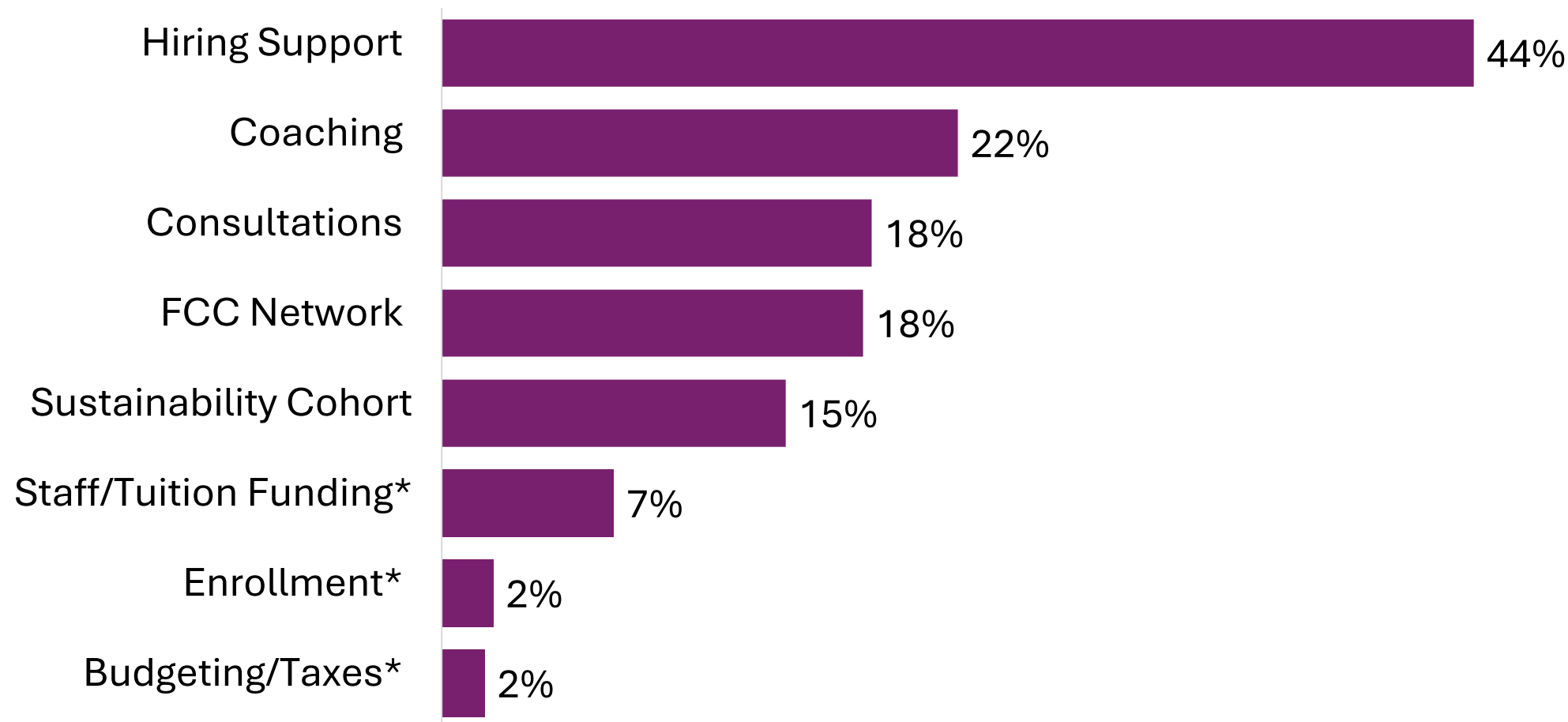

If You Didn't Apply, What Are Your Current Sustainability Needs?



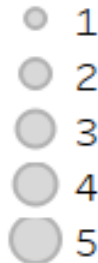

Providers' Knowledge of CFMF Grants (n = 450)

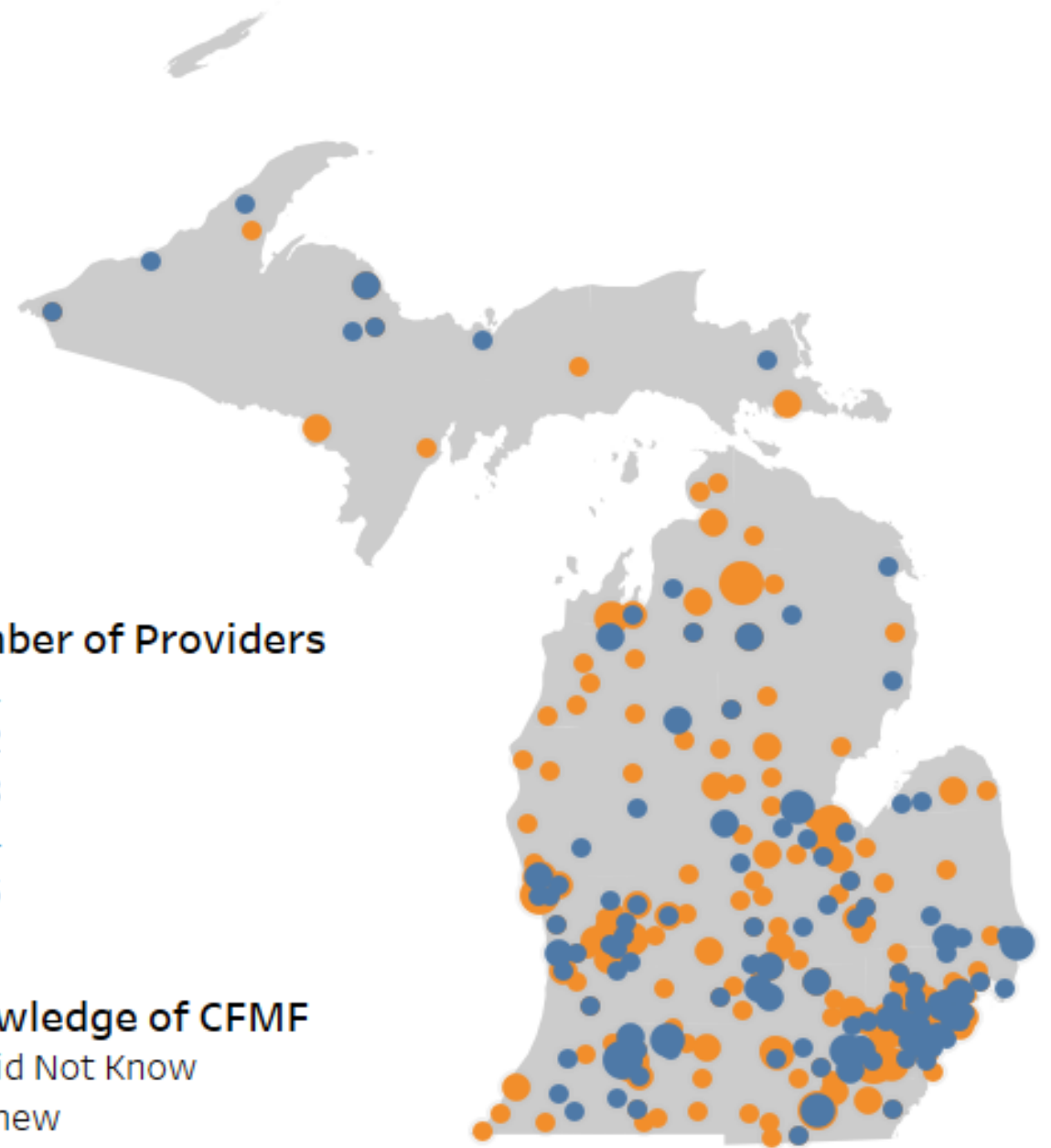
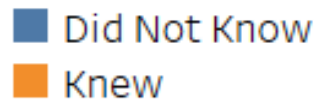
Knowledge **mostly did not vary** by economic development regions or geographic types.

Number of Providers



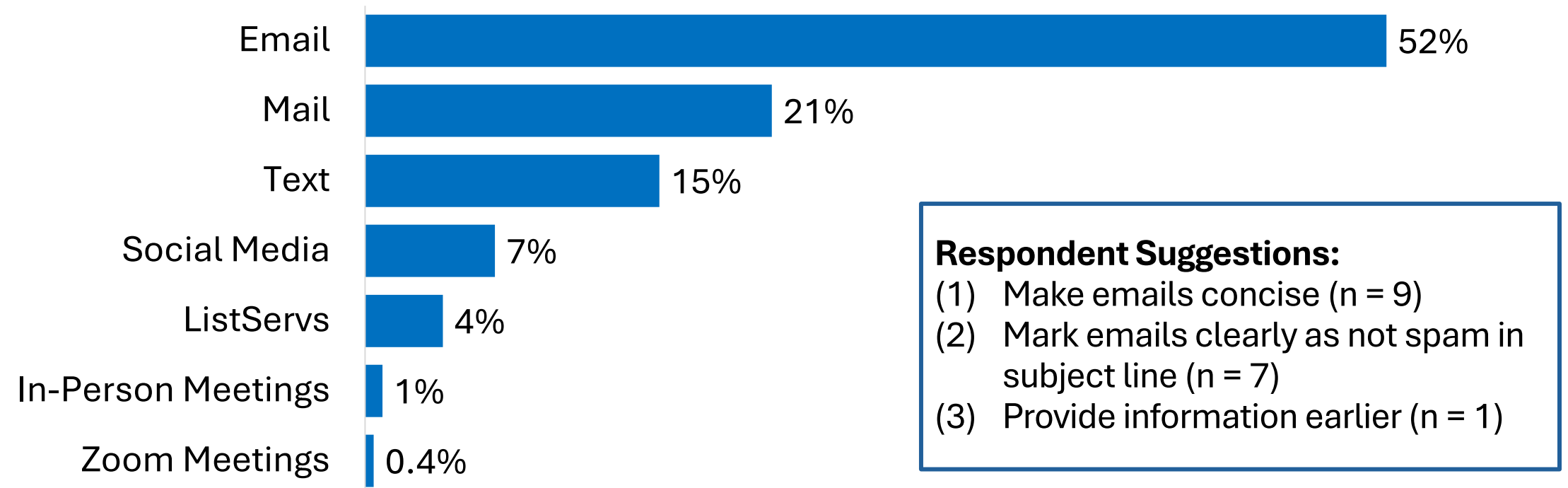

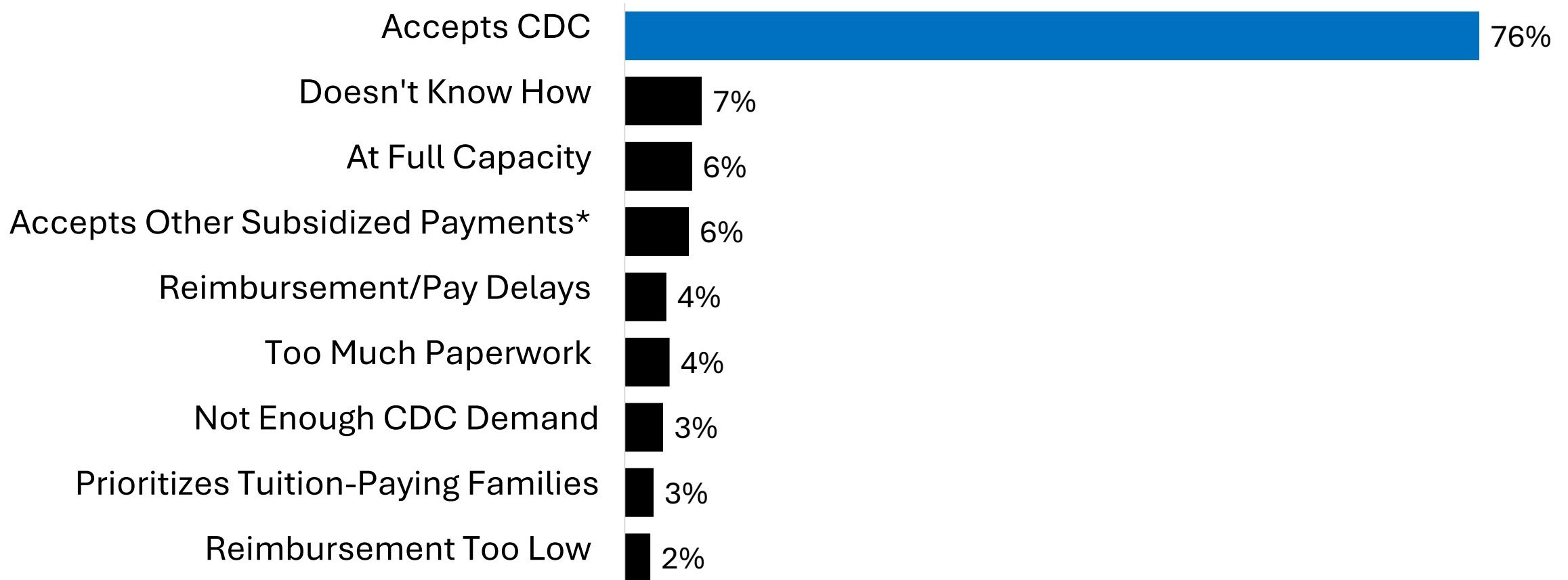

Which Communication Method(s) Do You Prefer?



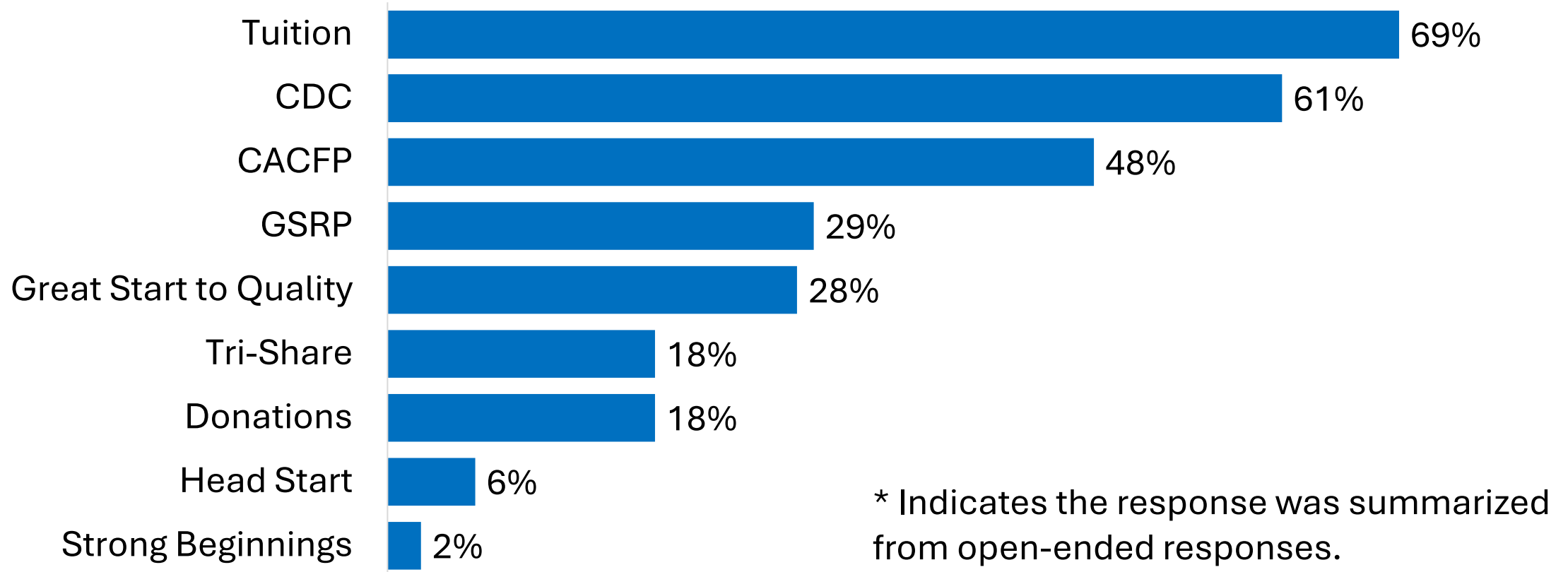

What Prevents You From Accepting the CDC Scholarship? (n = 352)



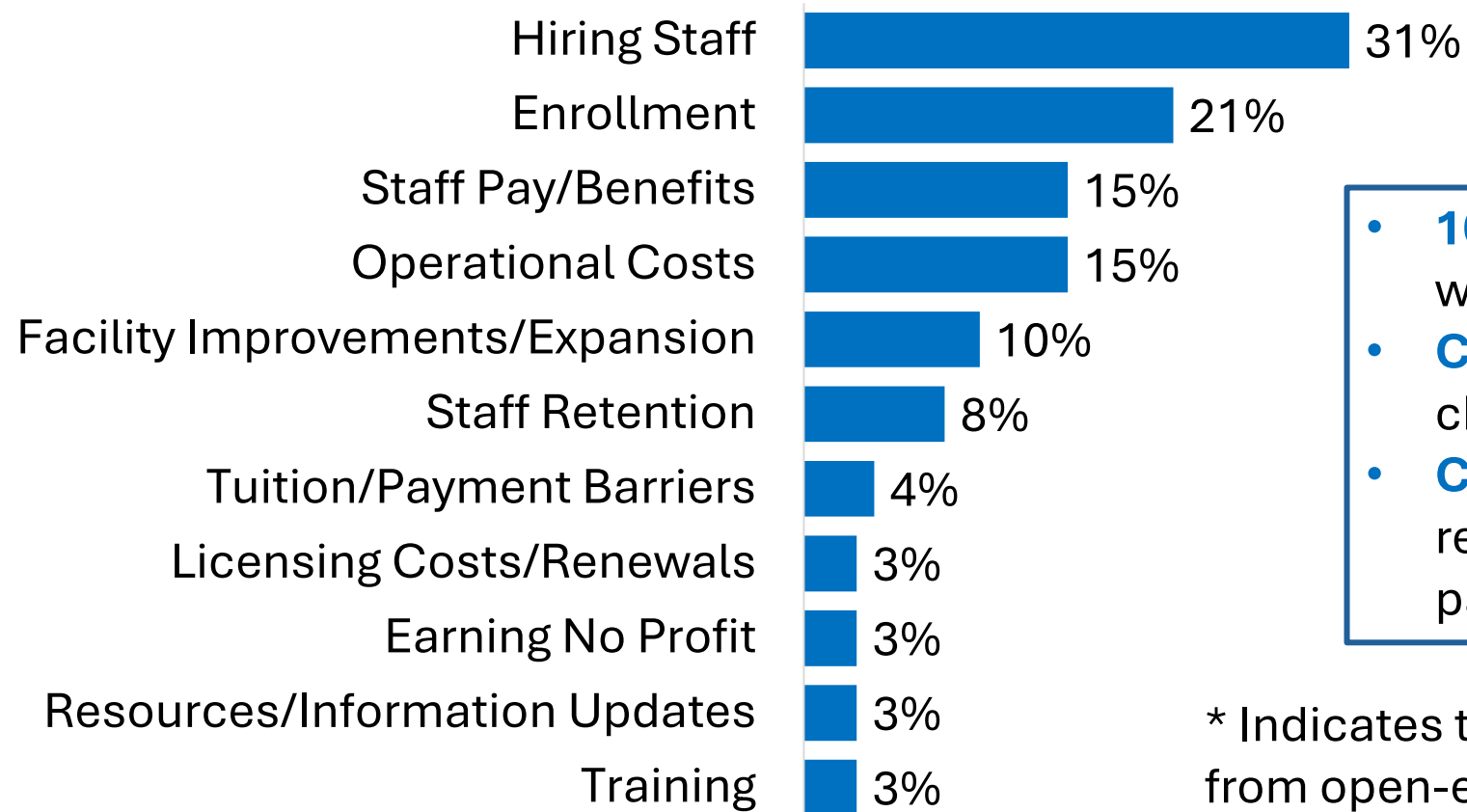

Current Sustainability Challenges* (n = 351)



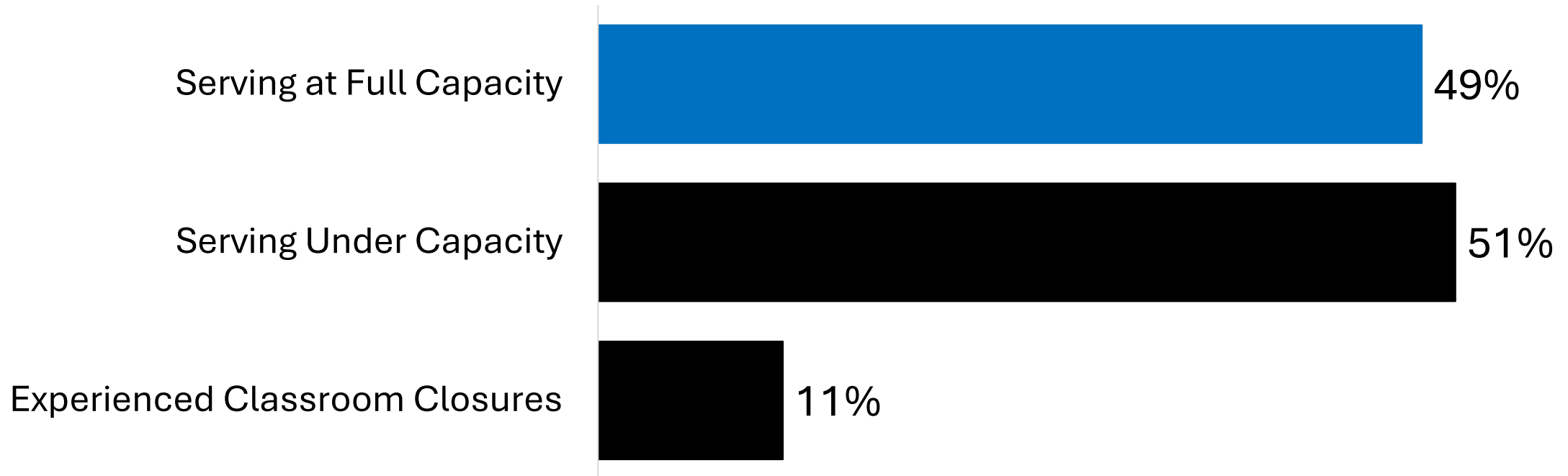
- **10%** of providers noted the issues with hiring **“quality”** staff.
- **Centers** reported more challenges with hiring staff.
- **Centers and group homes** reported more challenges in paying staff.

Being at full or under capacity and experiencing closures **did not vary** by economic development region.

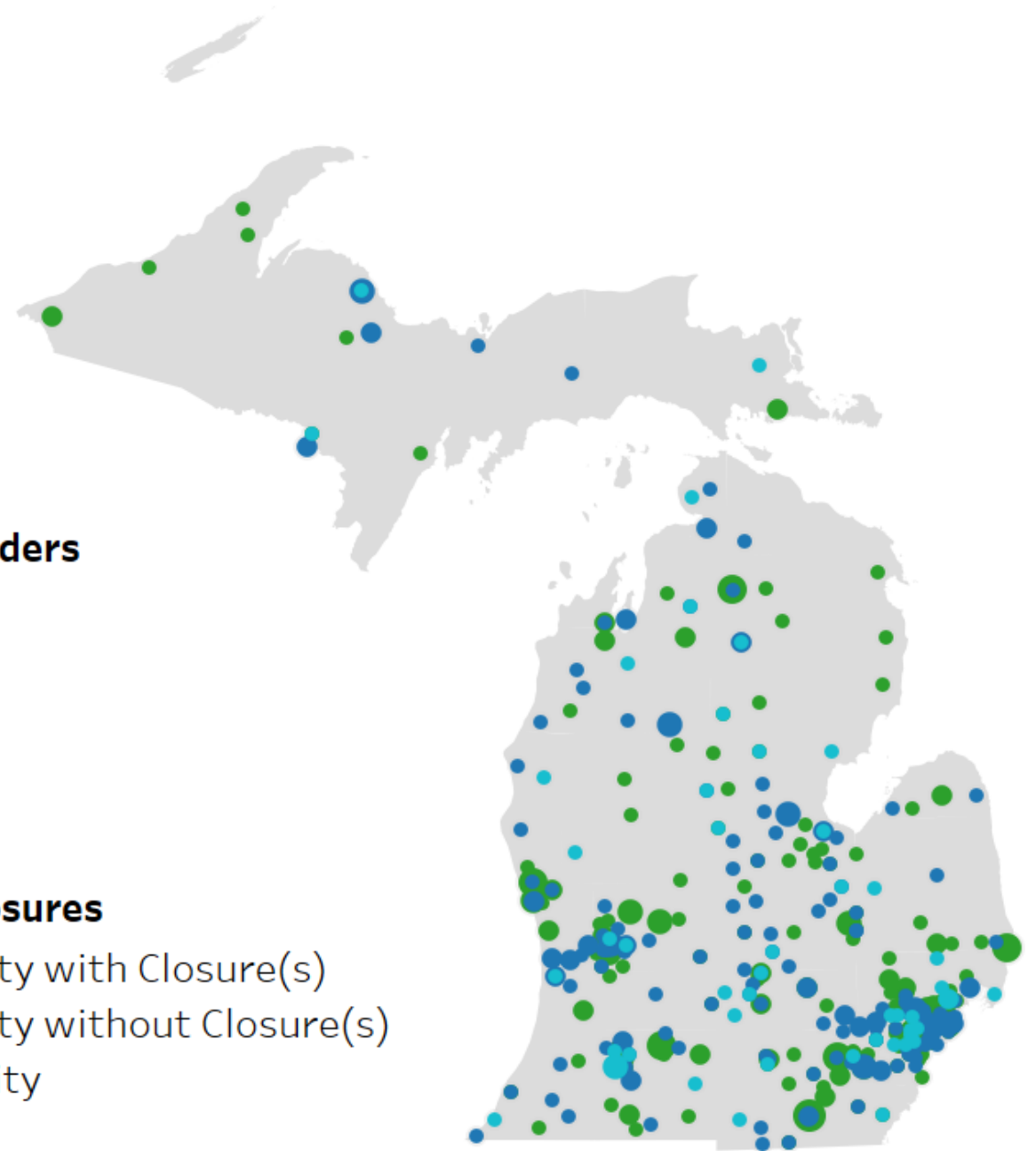
Centers, providers in rural areas, and providers serving preschoolers were **more likely** to report being under capacity.

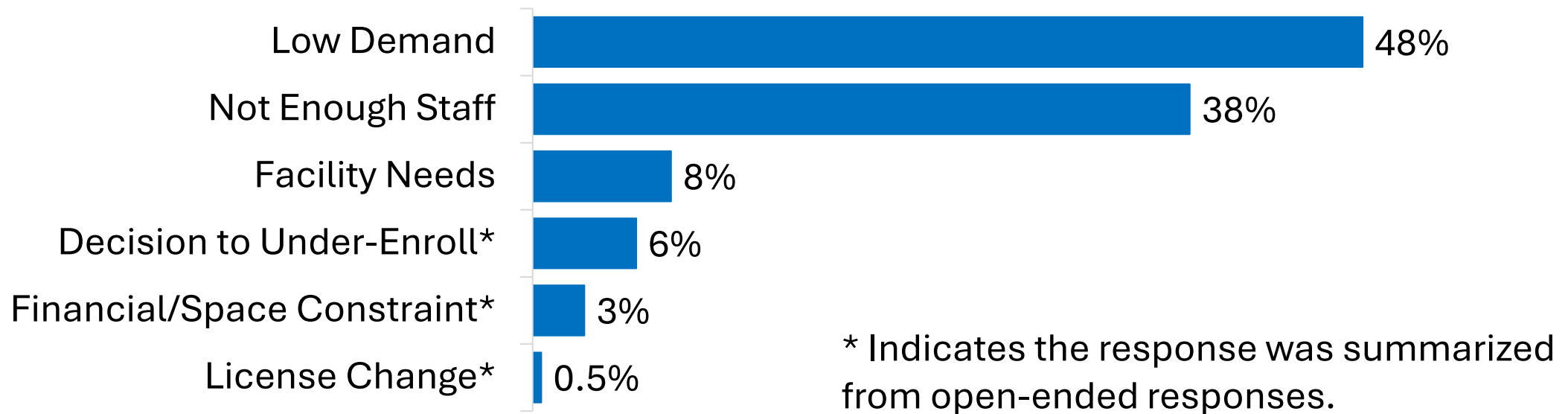

Reason for Being Under Capacity or Experiencing Closures (n = 231)



Providers serving **preschoolers** were most likely to attribute being under capacity or closed to **low demand**, whereas providers serving **infants and toddlers** were most likely to report **not having enough staff**.

Map of providers under capacity or facing classroom closure due to *low demand*

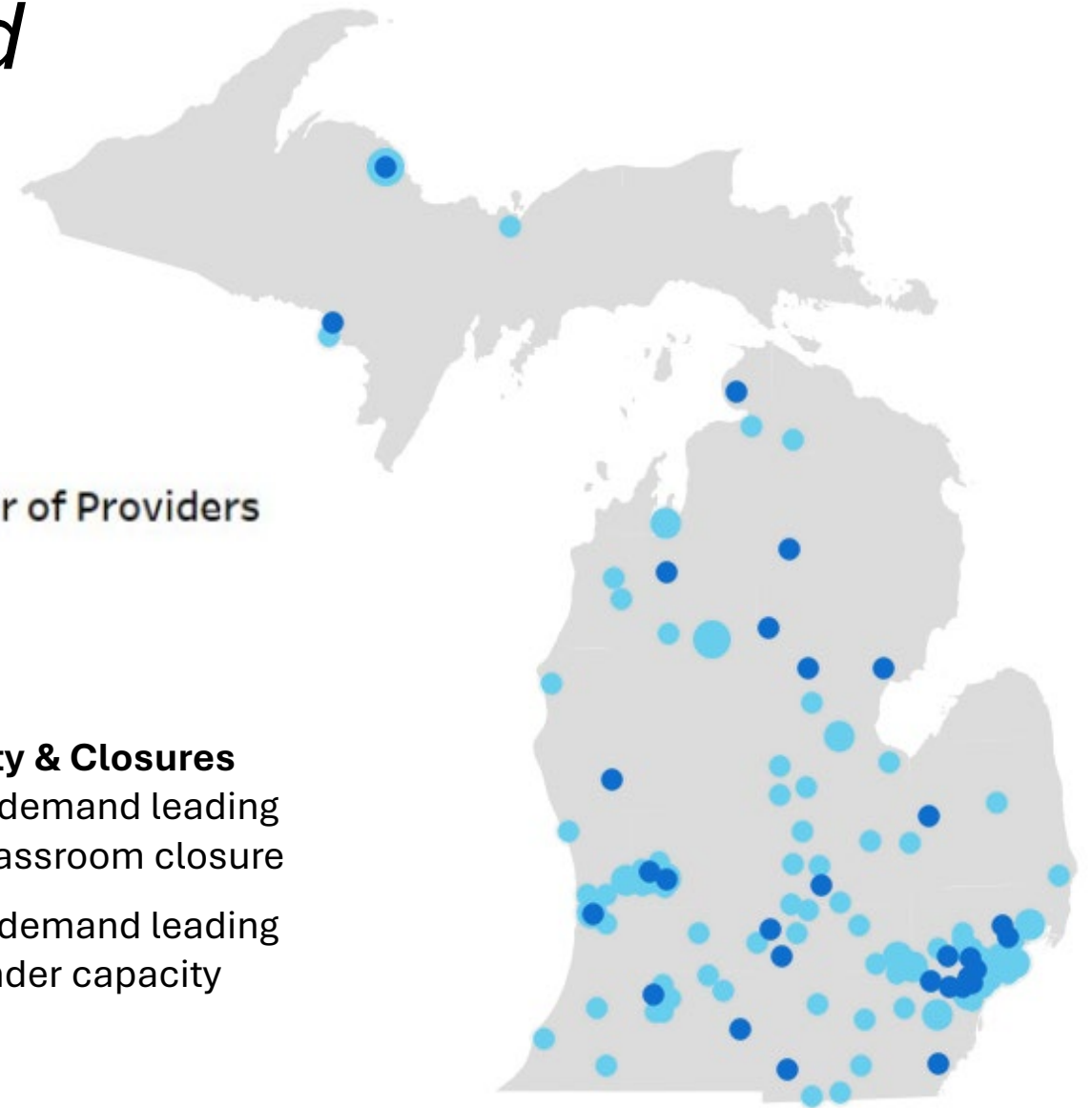
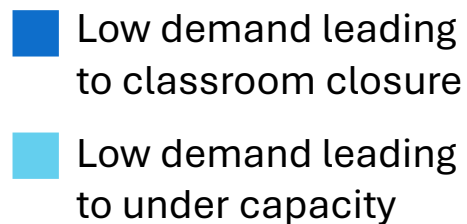
Providers' being under capacity or facing classroom closures due to low demand **varied significantly** by economic development region.

The Detroit Metro and West Michigan regions were most affected, representing 31.8% and 17.1% of impacted providers across regions.

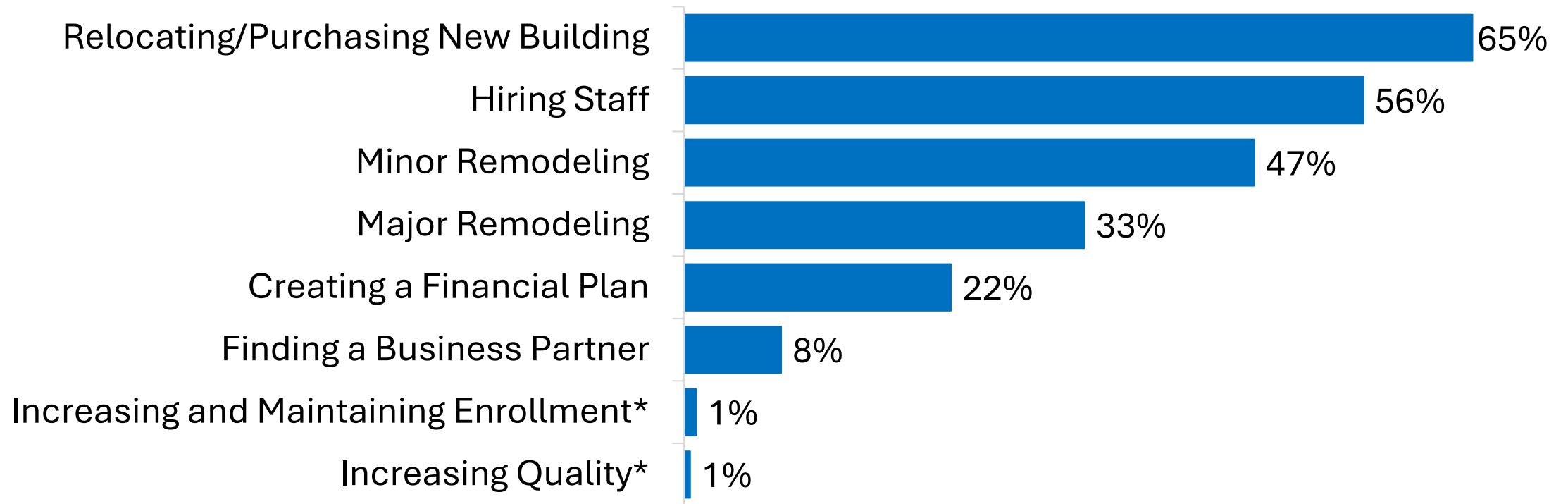
Number of Providers

Main Conclusions

CFMF Grants

The most common reason for not applying to CFMF grants was **not knowing** about them.

Major Challenges

1. Hiring, paying, and retaining staff
2. Increasing and maintaining enrollment
3. Managing operational costs

Expansion Support Needs

1. Facility improvements (e.g., relocating, minor and major remodeling)
2. Hiring staff

Dissemination

Email preferred with concise content, clear subject lines, and early communications.

Reasons Under Capacity or Closing Classrooms

1. Low demand (especially for preschool)
2. Not having enough staff (especially for providers serving infants/toddlers)
